I have a slightly different approach to downloading a file, does that account for the problem? If it doesn't then please tell me, and point out the error so I can work on it. A: Your approach wont work if you use an array as the value of the filename attribute of the Content-Disposition header. Content-Disposition is a header used to indicate the file's disposition, usually whether it is appropriate to open (as opposed to save, for example) the file with a specific application. \$file = \$file.'.zip'; You can't just pass an array to the Content-Disposition header, instead you need to specify a filename for the header and pass an array to encode the type, filename, and disposition in the same way. header('Content-Disposition: attachment; filename="'. \$file. '"; filename*=utf-8'); Also, be aware that the Content-Type header value is a MIME type, but you're passing it a value that simply says that
